

POLICE COURT.—Monday: Before G. C. Uppleby and T. Tombleson, Esqs., and the Rev W. W. G. Giffard.—Simpson Coult, of Glasgow-street, Newington, Hull, was charged with fraudulently converting to his own use two watches entrusted to him to repair by James Trought, of Bonby, on the 28th July last. The complainant proved giving the prisoner two watches to clean on the day mentioned at Bonby, and the prisoner told him he lived in Barton. Witness told him he need not hurry over them, and the prisoner said they would be returned in two or three weeks, but he never returned them. Joseph Proudley and Edward James Collier, pawnbroker's assistants, Hull, proved that both the watches had been in pawn, and redeemed before the prisoner was apprehended. Sergeant Cobb apprehended the prisoner, and found him living under the name of Nelson. He found complainant's watches at prisoner's house. Committed for trial at the next Quarter Sessions at Great Grimsby.—
