# This Indenture

made the sixth day of September One thousand

eight hundred and ninety Between William Daniel of number 11 Crystal Avenue Chalk Lane in the Borough of Kingston upon Hull Signalman of the first part Walter Daniel of 11 Crystal Avenue aforesaid minor son of the said William Daniel of the second part and Henry Willford and Edward Robson both of the same borough Gentlemen carrying on business in copartnership under the style of the Hull Cart Wagon and Iron Company of the third part Witnesseth that the said Walter Daniel hath of his own free will and with the consent of the said William Daniel his father put and bound himself apprentice to and with the said Henry Willford and Edward Robson and with them after the manner of an apprentice to dwell remain and serve from the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1889 until the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1897 during all which said term the said apprentice his said masters well and faithfully shall serve their secrets keep their lawful commands shall do fornication or adultery he shall not commit hurt or damage to his said masters shall not do or consent to be done but as far as he may be able shall prevent it & thereof give notice to his said masters taverns or alehouses he shall not use or frequent unless he be about his masters business at dice cards tables bowls or any other unlawful game he shall not play the goods of his masters he shall not waste nor lend or give to any person without his masters license matrimony within the said term he shall not contract nor from his masters service at any time without leave absent himself but as a true and faithful apprentice shall order and behave himself towards his said masters and families as well in words as deeds during the said term and true and just accounts of all his masters goods chattels and money committed to his charge which shall come to his hands faithfully he shall give at all times when thereunto required by his said masters their executors administrators or assigns And the said William Daniel for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns doth hereby covenant with the said Henry Willford and Edward Robson that the said Walter Daniel shall and will serve the said Henry Willford and Edward Robson in manner aforesaid in their apprentice for the term aforesaid And also that he the said

William Daniel will find and provide the said Walter Daniel with all necessary and suitable clothing (and have the same mended and washed) food lodgings ~~and~~ medicine and medical attendance during the said term ~~And~~ the said Henry Willford and Edward Robson for themselves their executors administrators and assigns do covenant promise and grant by these presents to and with the said William Daniel and Walter Daniel apprentice that they the said masters their executors administrators or assigns shall and will teach learn and instruct him the said apprentice or cause him to be taught learnt and instructed in the trade of a wheelwright and body hands in connection with their said business which they the said masters now useth in the best and most effectual manner that he or they shall be able with all the circumstances thereunto belonging and also will pay unto the said Walter Daniel wages at the rate of three shillings per week from the date hereof until the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1891 and for the remaining six years of the term as follows four shillings per week for the first year five shillings per week for the second year six shillings per week for the third year seven shillings per week for the fourth year eight shillings per week for the fifth year and ten shillings per week for the sixth year

**Provided** always that if the said Walter Daniel be absent through sickness or ill health the said Henry Willford and Edward Robson shall not be obliged to pay wages during such absence And for the true performance of all and singular the covenants and agreements hereinbefore expressed each of the parties aforesaid doth bind himself unto the other firmly by these presents
