The petition of Arthur Edward Levings hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
First. My place of residence is 1745 Newman Street, PORTLAND, OREGON
(Give number, street, city or town, and State.)
Second. My occupation is Blacksmith
Third. I was born on the 18th day of January, anno Domini 1 872, at Gravesend, Kent, England
Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Victoria, B.C. Canada, on or about the 1st day of August,
anno Domini 1 922, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Seattle, Wash., on the 1st day of August,
anno Domini 1 922, on the vessel S. S. Princess Victoria
(If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)
Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 27th day of December, anno Domini 1 922
at Portland, Oregon, in the U. S. District Court of Oregon
Sixth. I am --- married. My wife's name is Lillian; she was born on the 7th day of July, anno Domini 1 877
at Yatton, England, and now resides at 1745 Newman St., Portland, Oregon

I have three children, and the name, date, and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Constance, Apr. 19, 1900 " Kent, England; " " Seattle, Wash.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to George V, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 1st day of August, anno Domini 1 922, and in the State of OREGON, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 1st day of August, anno Domini 1 922, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. ~~I made petition for citizenship to the Court of~~
~~at~~, on the ~~day of~~, anno Domini 1 ~~---~~, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit ~~---~~, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
